

Seminar #1: Friday, September 22, 2023 AM: Creative Problem Solving PM: Restorative Centric Dr. Mark Malterud

Level: Entire Team

AM: CREATIVE PROBLEM SOLVING

Often, we are presented with challenges to provide quality care for our patients in the form of rampant caries control, emergency fractures or even the need for a restoration that must be done that day. Couple these challenges with the patients' budget restrictions, and you find yourself thinking hard about how to provide services that will accomplish a satisfactory resolution. This lecture will present a technique of using a Nanohybrid heat and pressure cured composite crown shell to rapidly fabricate a quality long term restoration. Providing this procedure offers a simple solution that fits any patient's economic situation. This inexpensive technique, which can be delegated to your team members and fabricated in your office lab, will solve these day-to-day issues. Using subtle variations of techniques enables these same team members to create a more permanent restoration.

Learning Objectives:

- The participants will be introduced to a new concept of fabrication of an in-office laboratory composite resin crown their team can accomplish in a short period of time
- The participants will understand the many situations where the composite resin crown can help them provide their patients with a very viable lower cost alternative to their current crown techniques.
- The economic viability of a resin crown will be discussed as to how it can be a better alternative, in many instances, over a CAD/CAM restoration.
- The participants will understand the entire process from diagnosis to fabrication.
 They will be able to return to their practice tomorrow, ready to work with their team and delegate the creation of new solutions for their patients.
- Hands-on participants will have an opportunity to fabricate a crown from a prepared tooth on special models so they will get the full experience of the process.

PM: RESTORATIVE CENTRIC

This lecture will explore the use of an anterior midpoint stop splint (AMPS) as a starting point to deciding what directions to take a restorative case. By knowing where the joint wants to be in its most relaxed position allows us to establish records that can guide us along the restorative path to a beautiful healthy smile. Knowledge of the basic anatomy of the joint and muscles of mastication will be taught to help participants understand the physiology of function and parafunction. An AMPS such as the NTI will allow not only establishing a restorative starting point but can help many of the patients in your practice who suffer from migraines or tension headaches. This course will also cover the indications and contraindications of use of the AMPS and how the clinician can problem solve using the signs and symptoms that manifest from the devices.

Learning Objectives:

- The participants have a better understanding of joint anatomy and how the excess muscle activity can trigger tension headaches and migrainous activities.
- The participants will have a step-by-step approach to achieve predictable results
 from understanding a starting reproducible jaw position. Whether it is establishing
 the vertical dimension of occlusion for a denture or a full mouth reconstruction,
 these devices can be used to find a relaxed and patient comfortable position.
- The participants will understand the a relationship between migrainous activity and nocturnal parafunctional activity and the extension of sleep disorders.
- The participants will learn the steps to fabricate an immediate in office AMPS and
 to adjust it properly. Once the efficacy of the device is established, a technique
 for creating a laboratory fabricated device will be taught, as many patients often
 desire a backup.
- The participants will see varied uses of the device and understand how each of the different designs can help in creating a more comfortable patient.

Dr. Mark Malterud is a practicing general and family dentist and focuses on comprehensive cosmetic and general dentistry incorporating minimally invasive biomimetic dental procedures. After graduating from the University of Minnesota School of Dentistry, Dr. Malterud trained at the L.D. Pankey institute, completing their entire continuum on comprehensive dentistry. He received his AGD Mastership and Life-Long Learning and Service Recognition award and currently sits on the AGD Foundation Board. His commitment to dental education not only as a teacher, but also as a student, has him personally attending well over 150 hours of dental continuing education each year. Dr. Malterud also consults with various other dental manufacturers on product development and testing. His passion for dentistry has enabled him to lecture both nationally and internationally.

He is now the Director of Third Party Programs and Insurance for Smile Source, a group dedicated to preserving the elite business of independent dental care, as well as, the Chief Dental Officer for First Pacific Corporation. Seminar #4: Friday, April 19, 2024 AM: Offensive Dentistry PM: Nobody Caries Dr. Brian B. Nový Level: Entire Team

AM: OFFENSIVE DENTISTRY

Let's face it, sitting through a lecture about dental caries or caries risk assessment isn't appealing (in fact it sounds downright boring). However, the science of clinical cariology is beginning to have an impact on restorative techniques and technology. Streptococcus mutans has more to fear than a rheostat, now that we're armed with salivary diagnostics and bioactive materials. At the end of this course, participants should be able to:

- Intervene medically in the caries process
- Control patient caries risk with focused therapeutics
- Design restorations to minimize recurrent decay
- Improve the prognosis of restorative treatment

PM: NOBODY CARIES

Sometimes it seems as though our patients don't grasp the basic concept of home care. Other times our patients with impeccable hygiene develop rampant decay and we feel helpless because we can't figure out what's going on. The mouth is a remarkable environment that cariologists are finally beginning to understand, and so can you. Come learn everything you didn't know about plaque and the amazing organisms that make the mouth a wonderful place to work. At the end of this course, participants should be able to:

Learning Objectives:

- Explain the mixed ecological approach to caries causation
- Apply Evidence Based and novel preventive therapies
- Quickly identify high caries risk patients before they develop disease
- Stop "watching" lesions and see them get smaller

Dr. Brian Nový is the Chief Dental Officer of the Alliance Dental Center, Massachusetts Public Employees Fund with faculty appointments at Harvard School of Dental Medicine and Western University. His awards include the Academy of General Dentistry Weclew Award, The ADA Evidence Based Practice Award, The ADAR/IADR Gies Award, and the ADA Adult Preventive Care Practice of the Year. He served on the ADA Council of Scientific Affairs from 2010 to 2014, and as President of the CAMBRA coalition. In 2016 he was appointed the Consumer Advocate, United States Food and Drug Administration Dental Products Panel.

Jefferson HealthAbington

Are you looking for a way to give back to your community and help those in need get dental services, but you do not know how to get started? Perhaps you have patients in your practice who have trouble affording their dental treatment. If so, the Jefferson Health Abington Dental Care Access Program could help you and your patients.

Our program uses existing resources by partnering with local dental providers to create a successful and cost-effective community model to meet the dental needs of the underinsured and uninsured residents of the greater North Penn area. We are looking for additional dental providers to widen our network of participating providers.

Should you choose to participate, the Jefferson Health Abington Dental Care Access Program will reimburse your office for the services provided. While the fees are discounted, they are better than current Medicaid reimbursement levels. In fact, for fiscal year 2024 we are increasing our fee schedule by 20%. Patients are responsible for a \$10.00 co-pay.




Dental Care Access Program

unmet dental needs of uninsured and underinsured individuals within the North Penn community

- Jefferson Health Abington administers the program
- Funded by the VNA Foundation of Greater North Penn
 - Received Delta Dental Community Care Foundation Access to Care Grant for 2022/2023
- The dental work is completed in the office of the participating dental provider and the dental provider is reimbursed by Jefferson Health Abington
 - Currently, our program has 12 different dental providers, which consist of 18 locations and 27 dentists
- The program serves all ages
 - Participants must reside in North Penn, Souderton, or Wissahickon school districts
- Household income must be below 300% of the federal poverty level
- Since the inception of the program, we have spent \$907,291.79 directly towards the dental care for our program participants



Since the inception of the program, 879 unique individuals have been served



Results from dental provider satisfaction surveys:
