Bonding optimization and proper material selection are crucial for the long term success of implant supported restorations. Scientific studies and step by step clinical protocols will be described in this lecture with the objective of improving success rates for single and multiple-unit CAD/CAM restorations.

Julián obtained his DDS from the Universidad Latina, Costa Rica in 2005, and then completed training as a prosthodontist at Universidad Intercontinental, Mexico in 2008. 

Financial Planning Information

Financial Aid for College

What About Financial Aid for College?

Financial aid for college consists of loans, grants, scholarships, and work study. Grants and scholarships are worth searching for because they don't have to be paid back, unlike student loans, which require an ongoing financial obligation, or work study, which requires a work commitment. There are generally three sources for college grant aid; the federal government, state higher-education agencies, and colleges.

In order to be considered for any type of grant aid, you or your child should file the federal government's financial aid application, the FAFSA. In addition, private colleges typically require the CSS Profile form or their own individual aid form. The FAFSA and CSS Profile can be filled out and submitted on line (the FAFSA is free but the CSS Profile has a fee). These forms do require some time to complete, but the time spent is worth it. Not only are these forms a prerequisite to various types of grant aid, but some colleges may require them in order for students to be eligible for college merit scholarships. Keep in mind that students must reapply for financial aid every year.

U.S. GOVERNMENT GRANTS

There are two main federal grants for college; Pell Grants and Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (FSEOGs). Both are based on financial need. The Pell Grant program is Uncle Sam's largest financial aid grant program. Pell Grants are available to undergraduate students with exceptional financial need, and are the foundation of every undergraduate student's financial aid package (for those who qualify). Graduate students are not eligible. Pell Grants are administered by the federal government and awarded on the basis of college costs and a financial need. Financial need is based on factors such as family income and assets. family size, and the number of college students in the family. For the 2017-2018 award year, the maximum Pell Grant is \$5,920.'

The FSEOG is the federal government's second-largest program. An FSEOG is available to undergraduate students who demonstrate the greatest financial need. (i.e., those students with the lowest expected family contributions). Priority is given to Pell Grant recipients. The FSEOG is a campusbased program, which means that the financial aid office at each college administers it. Every college receives a certain amount of FSEOG funding from the federal government each year, and when the funds are awarded, there are no more until the following year. So even though a student might be eligible for an FSEOG based on his or her financial need, the funds may have already been expended for that year. The maximum FSEOG award is \$4,000 per academic year, and awards can range from \$100 to \$4,000.

STATE GRANTS

Many states offer grant programs as well. Each state's grant program is different, many give special preference to state residents planning to attend an in-state school. For more information, contact your state's higher-education agency.

COLLEGE GRANTS

Finally, many colleges offer specialized grant programs. This is particularly true of older schools with many alumni and large endowments. About this AM Course: Implants in the Esthetic Zone: Achieving Proper 3D Positioning with a Digital Workflow

The placement of dental implants to replace missing teeth has become standard in dental practice yet the esthetic zone still presents challenges. Proper 3D implant

placement is crucial to success. An understanding of the role of soft and hard tissues in the long term outcome is crucial in the planning phase for an ideal prosthetic outcome. New techniques and technologies have now made it possible to routinely achieve this precise implant positioning. Use of planning software, 3D printing, surgical guides and proper component selection will be discussed in this course.

The fabrication of dental appliances in the dental practice is not as routine as it once was. Most appliances are currently sent to outside labs for fabrication due to the cost of materials, equipment and labor. 3D printing has the potential to change that significantly. Low cost 3D printers and materials are available now that promise to reduce lab costs and turnaround time for the dental practice. Indeed, there are appliances that cannot be fabricated cost effectively without 3D printing. This course will cover the various 3D printing techniques and how we can use them to fabricate several types of appliances commonly used in dentistry.

in Everyday Practice"



ABOUT THIS COURSE:

The range of drug therapy options available to dental practitioners has greatly expanded over the past ten years. This expansion has opened the door to unprecedented therapeutic successes as well as disastrous drug misadventures. This course will update the dental team on recent developments in dental pharmacotherapy while providing strategies for prescribing to ensure therapeutic success. Penn dental school receives \$1 million grant for students pursuing communitybased dentistry

Philadelphia — The University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine announced Sept. 20 that it received a \$1 million scholarship grant from Delta Dental Community Care Foundation to help financially support students pursuing a career in community-based dentistry.

Delta Dental's Oral Health Education grant will award two \$25,000 scholarships each year to dental students who desire to work in an underserved area after graduation and who have demonstrated a commitment to community outreach during their students. The first application cycle will open this fall for interested candidates in the current third-year class, according to the announcement. "What's exciting about this scholarship is that it will provide the support that some students need to ultimately pursue this path after graduation," said Dr. Joan Gluch, division chief of community oral health, and co-director of the grant. "The need is great because approximately 48 million people in the United States live in areas with dentist shortages."

Penn dental school receives \$1 million grant for students pursuing community-

The scholarships from the philanthropic branch of Delta Dental of Pennsylvania are intended to lighten the overall expenses and debt during the recipient's fourth-year of study.

"The availability of scholarships to offset loans can be a deciding factor for students who may have considerable undergraduate debt, or who come from a financially challenged background," said Dr. Olivia Sheridan, co-director of the grant and assistant dean for admissions, in a news release. Over time, Penn Dental Medicine announced that the grant funding can also contribute valuable data to community health needs assessment and further expands a relationship between Delta Dental Community Care Foundation and the dental school.

In 2017, the foundation awarded Penn Dental Medicine a \$650,000 grant to expand PennSmiles, the school's oral health education and clinical care program for schoolchildren and their families in Philadelphia.


